Reservations and Supplements

Some European trains – such as high-speed and long distance trains – often require a seat reservation at an extra cost. The orange lines on this map provide an overview of the main routes on which trains operate that may require a compulsory reservation or supplement. Generally, trains without compulsory reservation also run on these routes.

Tip: The Rail Planner app gives you the possibility to apply the filter 'no reservations needed'. Please note that this option might increase the travel time and train changes for your journey. The app indicates that a reservation is compulsory by showing the following line:
